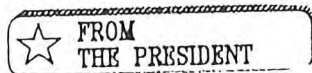

CO-ORDINATION of our activities is vital to avoid you spending more time than necessary in your Zonta role.

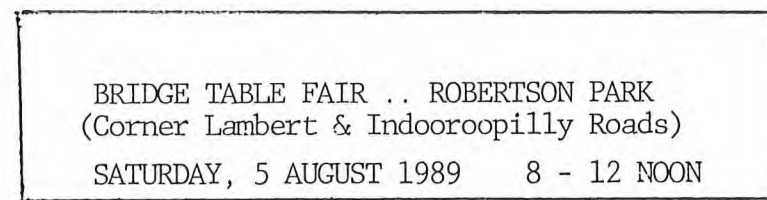

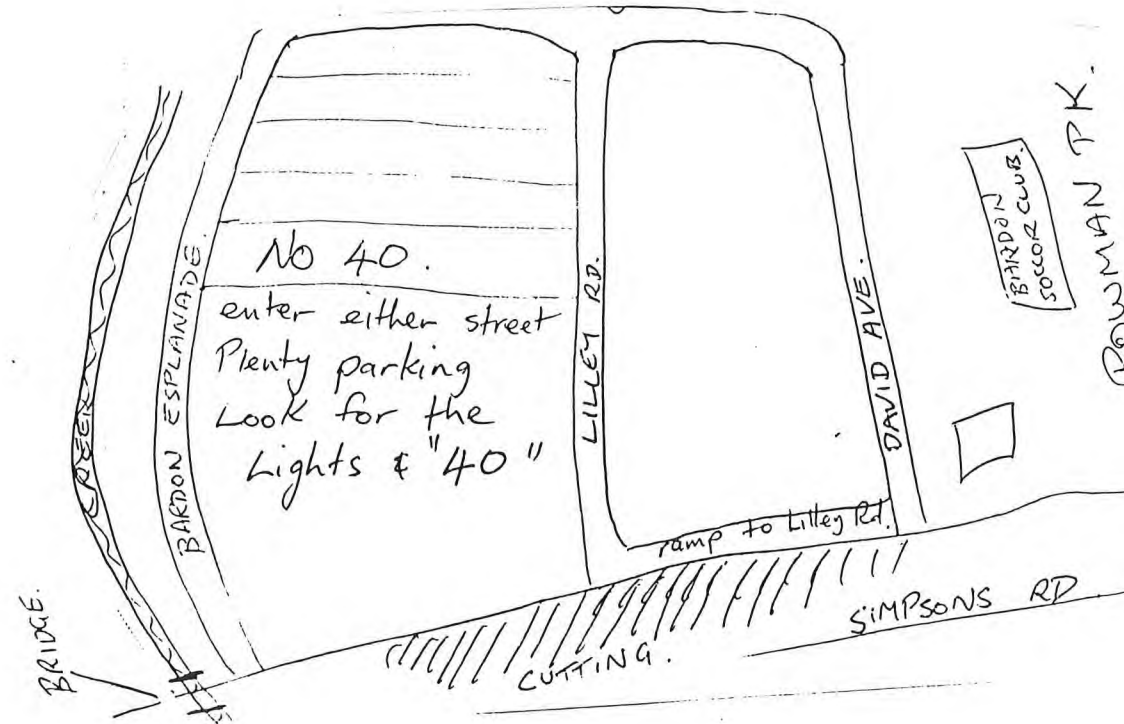

BY-LAWS REVISION AS IT AFFECTS M & C COMMITTEE:

- Membership & Classif. Cttee verifies qualifications & presents names to Board (as now) but invites person to join and then notifies the general membership (no 10 day exposure to general membership for approval)
- The forfeiture of membership due to absence from Club meetings to be eliminated
- On leave of absence (limit one year as now) specific reasons of health and business to be added
- For members admitted from Dec 1st to May 31st, Clubs shall pay one half the per capita dues to Zonta International
- Categories: Classified, Senior Classified, Merited, Affiliate Member at Large, Past International President and Honorary.
  - Classified: actively engaged (does not specify 60% of time in a worthy and recognized business or profession on a decision-making capacity.
  - Senior Classified: after 10 years of Zonta service, member would automatically be transferred to this category and would retain classification, but transfer would enable the addition of a new classified member into the classification
  - Merited Member: (formerly past classified) retiring within 10 years of joining. (Current Merited members could apply for Senior Classified if have had ten years of service before retiring).
  - Affiliate Member: temporarily ineligible for classified membership but expects to qualify again and must do so within 3 years or membership will be terminated. Must have held classified membership for 3 years or be a Charter Member

OTHER MATTERS PROPOSED:

- Resignations to be sent to President for submission to Board (at present it is sent to the Secretary).
- Office of President-Elect recommended in larger Clubs for continuity and better planning
- Elimination of membership limitation on eligibility to serve on nominating committee
- Provision for election of Nominating Committee at annual election for officers and Directors to have committee in place immediately to review candidates for future service to the Club

RECOMMENDATION FOR REVISION OF DRAFT:

Article VIII, Section 6 - Committees.

THAT: The names of new members and losses of membership shall be reported on authorised forms to Zonta Headquarters, District Governor-Elect and Treasurer within 30 days.

Reason for proposed Revision: One week does not give enough time for communication between the officers concerned or allow for any unavoidable delays in collecting dues.

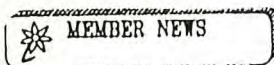

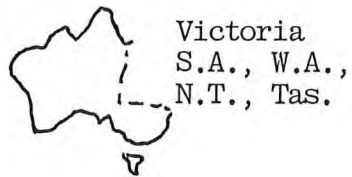
